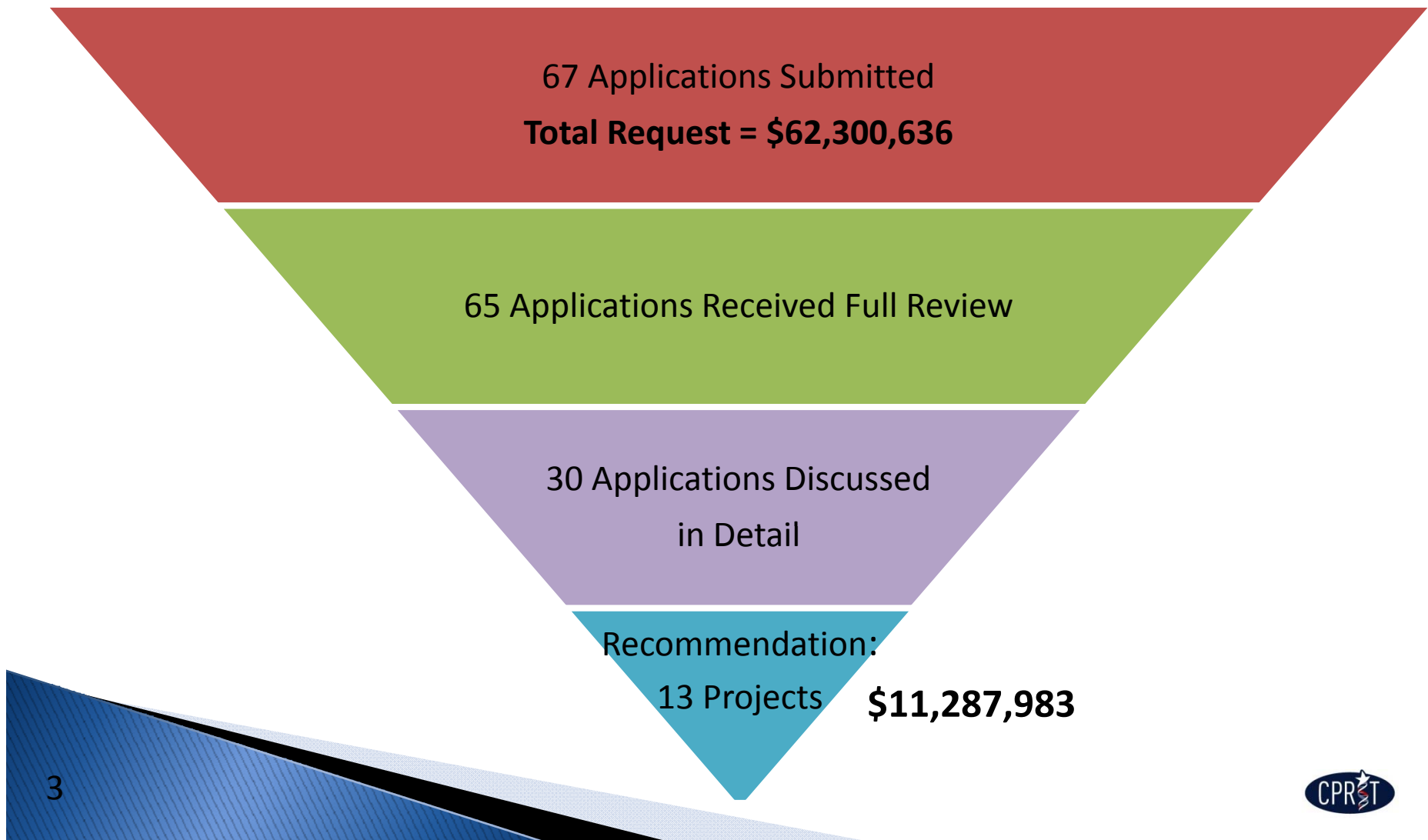
# Prevention Program YTD Impact

## Grantee Progress Report Update

In first 14 months of reporting, 53 projects report:

- Over **58,000** people received education, outreach, navigation services
- Over **34,000** people screened
  - **26,498** (78%) never before screened
- **1,514** abnormal screening results
- **98** precursors detected (**39** never before screened)
- **123** cancers detected (**32** never before screened)

# Evidence-Based Cancer Prevention Services

Up to \$3M up to 3 years

Provides for the delivery of evidence-based services:

- Primary Prevention (e.g. smoking cessation, vaccines, healthy lifestyle and obesity control)
- Secondary Prevention (e.g. screening for breast, cervical, colorectal)
- Tertiary Prevention (e.g. reducing risk of recurrence, improving quality of life)

Up to \$150K up to 24 months

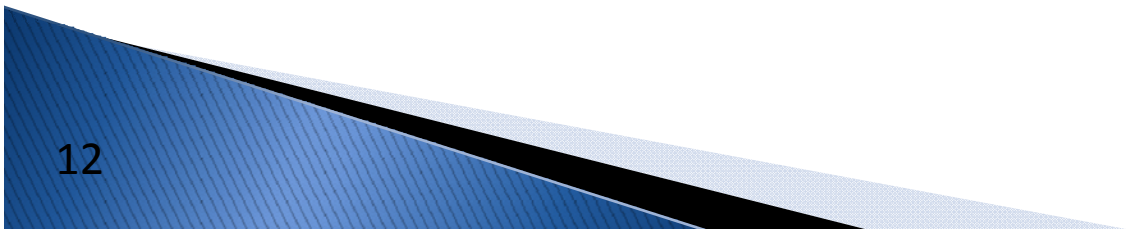
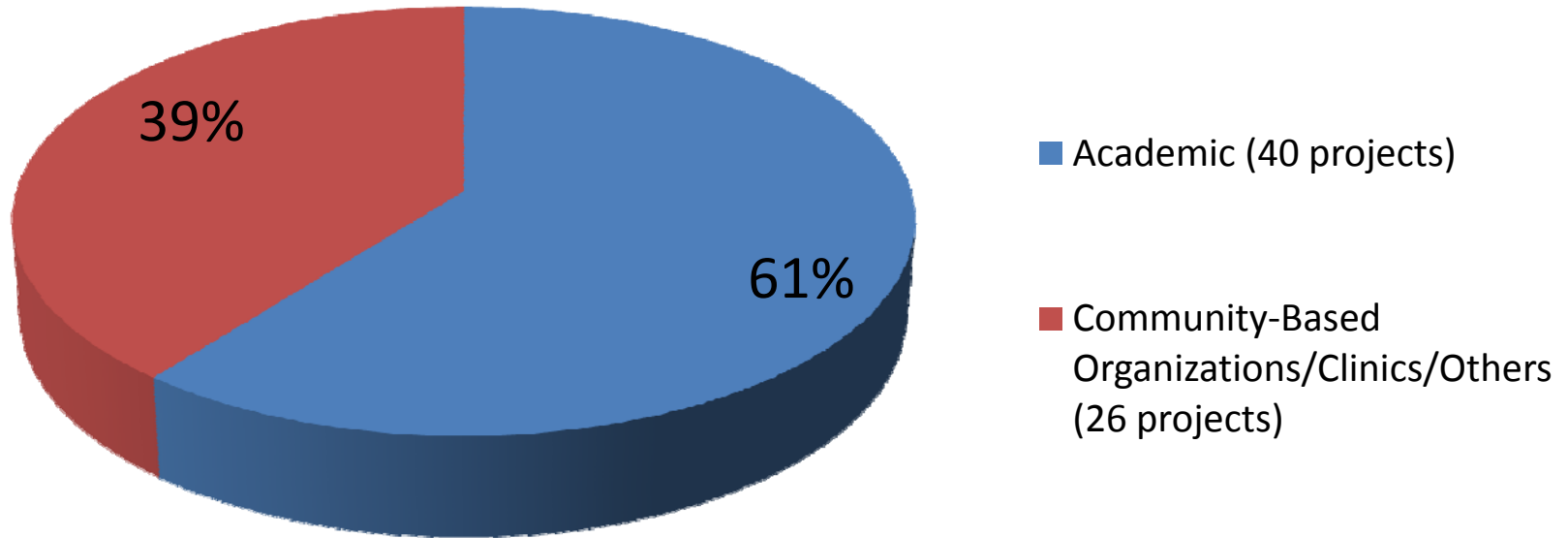
- Focus—systems change for tobacco cessation or access to screening

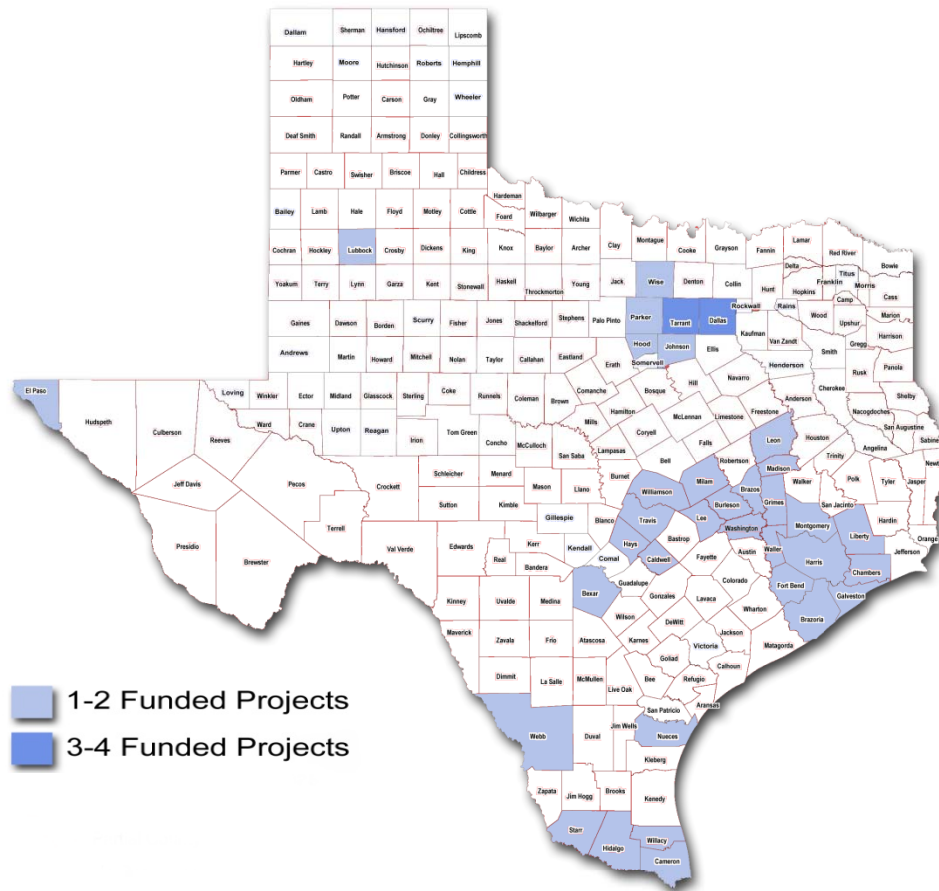
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# Organization Type Current Awards + Slate



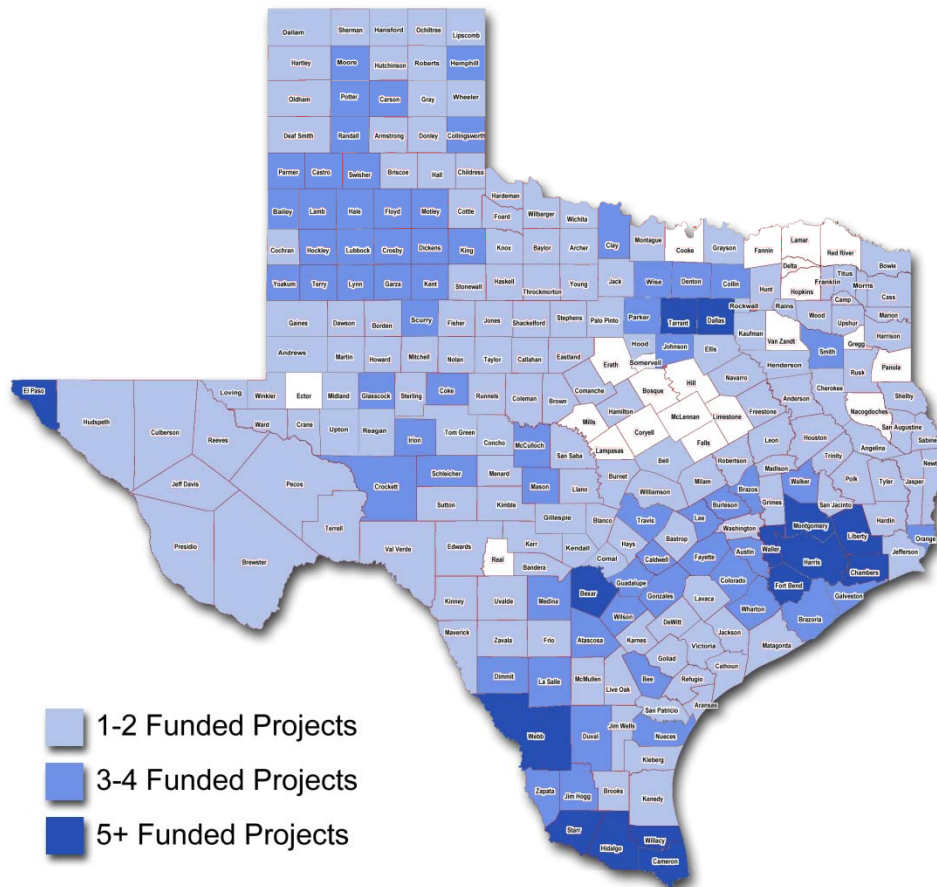
# Counties Served: Slate (13 Projects)
